
Pulse Width Modulated Fan Control - What???

How many times have you been in a parade, or your best friend pulls up beside you, or a car comes through the cruise-in...and all you can hear is an electric fan ROARING like a tornado? It may have been Lynn's '52 Chevy that you heard coming! Electric fans are often the solution to overheating problems, especially at low vehicle speeds, like a creeping parade. And the classic way to connect an electric fan is through a temperature switch in the water jacket somewhere.

When the water in the engine reaches 180 degrees or so, the temperature switch closes, and the radiator fan comes on full speed. At the same time, the water in the radiator begins to cool rapidly, sending cooler water into the engine. It circulates into the water jackets of the engine, where the fan temperature switch senses the cooler water and turns off the fan...back and forth, back and forth.

Somewhat independent of the fan turning on and off, the engine thermostat is opening and closing. It is desperately trying to regulate a constant engine temperature, by holding the water in the engine, or releasing it to the radiator. And all the time, the water coming into the engine is constantly changing. If you have a typical electric fan set up on your classic car, you have seen this in the temperature gauge. The temperature starts to get into the hot range, then the fan ROAR starts, the temperature gauge moves down 10-20 degrees, the fan turns off, and then it starts all over again.





you probably have not heard the cycling typhoon roar of the fan. The reason is that car manufacturers don't switch their fans to high speed and back to off, like many of us old car guys do. Why not? Well for one thing, turning on and off a heavy duty fan motor causes a huge in-rush of current, shocking the alternator and the associated wiring and fuse, the alternator belt, and, not to mention, the fan! There are other ways to control the fan. Some systems use a two speed fan and controller. But others use a more elegant solution called a Pulse Width Modulated fan controller.

Like Smucker's jams, with a name like that, it HAS to be good, right? The PWM controller is an electrical geek's dream come true. You probably use one every day. Whenever you operate a light dimmer, you may be using a PWM light controller. In the old days we used to control electric circuits with a rheostat, a simple resistive device that soaked up a part of the energy and converted it to heat, while we enjoyed a dimmed light or a slower motor speed. While very inefficient, it served a purpose while we waited for electronics to catch up with our needs.

Modern electronics can now be used to control an AC circuit by modifying the normal 60 cycle waveform, resulting in more off time and effectively changing the average voltage applied to the device. In the case of our cars and trucks, we are dealing with a DC voltage. Essentially it is always "on" compared to an AC voltage that swings both positive and negative 60 times per second. So the job of the PWM controller is to change that constant 12 volt supply into a series of pulses spaced close together for a high average voltage, and further apart for an average lower voltage. The pulses may occur thousands of times each second! The following figure shows this perhaps better than it can be explained in words. The result is a variable voltage from a constant 12 volt source, enabling infinite control over a fan motor speed. And all of this is virtually without heat or losses like we experienced with old fashioned rheostats.

So now that we know all about Pulse Width Modulation, how can it be used to more accurately control our engine temperatures, and prevent the dreaded ROAR of the fan? Simple. You let the electronic programmers handle the heavy stuff. All we have to do it hook it up. In my case (or I should say Lynn's case) I had several problems I wanted to solve. The first was the ROAR! But the second was probably more important. Each time the fan cut on at full speed, the engine idle would dip momentarily as the alternator grunted against the 30 - 40 amps of inrush current. The serpentine belt would issue a brief chirp followed by the full speed roar of the fan.



The controller I installed is manufactured by a guy named Darryl Dashiell. Darryl goes by www.autocoolguy.com (There are other manufacturers.) I measured the current draw of the fan in Lynn's '52 Chevy truck and found it to be no

more than 20 amps, after the initial inrush of current. The PWM I bought is rated at 50 amps. There are several wires to be run for proper control. First, it senses the OUTPUT temperature of the radiator (lower radiator hose) since that is what needs to be controlled for an even cooling of the engine. (What good does it do to know the temperature coming out of the engine? That's too late for proper fan control!) A sensor can be installed in various ways to get this measurement. It also needs to know if you turn on the



air conditioner. The fan is then forced to run at a set speed in order to get air flow over the A/C condenser coil. In addition to the heavy fan wires, the controller needs a ground, ignition 12V, and constant 12V to provide the various functions, and a safety bypass switch, so there are several wires to be run. But your old fan relay is discarded.

So how does it work? Start the engine and the fan does not run at all. Wait a while and as the lower radiator outlet starts to warm, the fan slowly starts to speed up. Ideally it wants to regulate the water temperature out of the radiator around 20 degrees below the thermostat rating, or say about 160 degrees. This minimizes the bouncing of the temperature gauge as slugs of cold water enter the hot engine, causing the thermostat to shut down. This is adjustable. Turn on the A/C and the fan ramps up (slowly) to about 60% of full speed, again adjustable. (If the engine gets hotter, the radiator temperature controls the fan to a higher speed.) Shut down a hot engine and the fan runs for an additional 15 to 60 seconds. As of yet, I have never seen the fan run wide open. In short, it is pretty cool to this old electrical geek. Nick.
