Old Tires on Your Car Can Have Tragic Consequences

We usually try to keep things on the lighter side here, but sometimes a serious topic needs to be brought up. This is about safety and how a small thing can lead to big consequences. Many of our hot rods don't see a ton of street miles compared to our daily drivers, and therein lies the rub. You see, parts don't just wear with use, they also wear over time. That's why oil change intervals have time, as well as mileage, attached. This also applies to tires. If you drive your car a few hundred, or even a few thousand, miles a year then chances are they are going to age out well before they wear out. Yeah, you'll look at the tread and think they are great, but, in fact, they aren't. The number one cause is dry rot, also called sidewall cracking. Many factors cause this, including oxygen, ozone, heat, UV light, long periods of siting, etc. And while you can slow it down, eventually time always wins and a tire becomes unsafe even though it looks fine at first glance.

At an event this summer a participant, Jerry "Waco" Andres, tragically died when a tire blew out on his '55. An older tire failed and the car rolled. After this I began looking at date codes on cars at the event and saw quite a few that were over 10 years old. The tires all had a ton of tread left, which is what most people look at to determine if it's time for new tires. But, when cars aren't driven much, time wins the race before wear.

So, inspect your tires regularly, look for unusual wear (especially on the inside edge), watch for strange bulges, as well as any small cracks, which are the first signs of dry rot or other tire problems. Remember



that sometimes the tires can crack on the inside, where you can't inspect. If you notice your tires don't hold air well, then that's also a sign of a possible problem. All tires are stamped with a date code. This code tells where the tire was made, but more importantly it gives the week and year they were made. Typically it's four digits, for example 1709, which would be the 17th week of 2009. A good rule of thumb is to replace tires that are older than six years. But if you see any signs of cracks replace them immediately. So let's have fun out there with our car, but also stay safe as well!

Editorial note: It was earlier this week when I witnessed (from a distance) a boat on a trailer being sold to someone. The bass boat, and outboard motor, had been sitting for probably 15 years. Who knows how old the tires were when it was parked! The new owner put air in the little flat 12 inch tires and pulled away with his new project. Personally, I would not have left the driveway with those little tires spinning around like they do. Perhaps others are blessed with good luck, and I hope he was too. He needed it. I don't know the outcome for this guy and his obvious unawareness of a big potential safety issue. But I do know that the above article often applies to knowledgeable car guys who just forget, or don't want to incur the expense of new tires. Whether the proper replacement time is 6 years, or 12 years, is up for debate and depends a lot on the storage conditions. Regardless, be careful out there. Nick

More on Reading Tire Codes...

Each tire has an imprinted DOT code. The four-digit DOT code is usually located in a window on the tire sidewall.



There are a lot of letters and numbers on a tire sidewall. Only one set is important to finding the date code. It is the one without any letters! In the above picture, let's find the date code:

M5EJ or 006X – Wrong! Do not use codes with letters! You need only the numbers.

3811 – Correct! It's the 4 digit number, 3811 in this example.

The **first two digits** of the code represent the week of production during the year (from 1 to 52). In this case, the tire was produced during the 38th week of the year.

The **second two digits** represent the year of manufacture. In this case, that would be 2011

If your DOT code is a 3-digit number, it means your tire was produced before 2000. Of course, this would not be a great tire to be driving on the road, and you may be WAY off when you read the date code, since the year repeated every decade. So a 427 date code would be the 42nd week of 1997, or 1987, or 1977, etc. If you have a three digit code, throw that tire away fast, or hang it from a tree for the grandchildren. Below is a handy online tire age calculator. Just plug in your date code.

May 1st Nick Ware made the following proposal:

Nick has come up with an idea to make GCC more attraction to our sponsors. We haven't been able to toot their horns at the Cruise-Ins all year. All they have gotten for their money is the satisfaction of helping GCC help others and the 24/7 advertisement on our website.

Nick has suggested we temporarily offer our sponsors three months extra sponsorship at no additional cost. In other words their sponsorship would be for 15 months instead of 12. We have sponsors that are most likely struggling. This might make it easier for our recruiters to approach current renewing sponsors.

This would require a bylaws interruption. This would not be a permanent change but a temporary suspension of our 12 month sponsorship policy.

"Any existing sponsors renewing in 2020, and any new sponsors joining in January through May of 2020, will receive a one-time grant of three extra months of free sponsorship by extension of their renewal date. Any new sponsors joining in June of 2020 or later will join for a normal one year membership. The intent of this provision is to compensate those sponsors who were on record during the months of March through June, when we did not have our regularly scheduled cruise ins due to the COVID-19 cancellations."

The Board unanimously voted to approve this proposal.

May 7^{th,} Rick sent out an e-mail to all GCC members for an online vote.

May 14^{th,} Our online meeting has ended. The vote to accept the temporary Bylaws exemption has passed by a vote of 31 for and 0 opposed. Thank you for participating.
